

An investigation of student's perception regarding career orientation in secondary schools at Tehsil Chakwal

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Abstract

The study aims to explore the perception of secondary school students in the tehsil Chakwal about future career. Students at very early stage of their study should be aware of their talent and orientation regarding their future career. Hundreds and thousands of students fail to opt their studies and career as per their aptitude. This situation of career counseling is grave at school levels. After secondary exams the students have to pick and choose their field of study as there are many but there are immense chances of selecting the wrong field. Hence, this study focuses on the perception of the learners. As a research method descriptive case study and open ended questionnaire was designed that is interpreted and explained under the heading of data analysis. Therefore, this study is pure qualitative study in nature researcher used cross sectional survey method applying descriptive case study on fifteen students from different schools. Researcher applied triangulation technique using three instrument qualitative questionnaires, descriptive interviews and observation for collecting data. The finding of this study reveal that majority of students are not clear about their future goals. There is too lack of career guidance in tehsil chakwal. Therefore in order to have a bright future of our youth we must improve quality of career guidance and also held career developing seminars in this Area.

Chapter #1

INTRODUCTION

Career counseling is basically a term used by Frank parson in (1909). Career counseling is also known as career guidance. In generally career means the particular occupation for which you are trained. Counseling or guidance means providing direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. So career counseling means to providing direction for your occupation. Career counseling is very important thing for our bright future. In my area I feel there is deficiency of career counseling. Students have no decision power for their further studies after matriculation. They get admission not by choice just by chance. There is no proper channel for guiding.

Second big problem of our area is regarding student career is depend on "only parents decisions" about child future. When our child born father says my child becomes a doctor. Sister or mother decides other occupation but nobody will ask from child what your interest is. What you want to become. I also point out another big issue that already happened with me. When our student completes their matriculation then first and foremost priority of our society, parents is to force to join army. There is nobody who asks what your own opinion? Which field is best for you? There is nobody ask



question from there self.so this is the biggest problem. When no one couldn't ask question from him or her. Why I came. What is my strong area and which work is appropriate for me. Which work can't give me a tired ness? When everyone ask these question from them then we will also achieve or goals. So first of all career orientation is most important thing for our student. We must work on it on emergency basis.

Career guidance is very basic need of our young generation. Without proper guidance we will not able to generate progressed nation. Imagine we want to go to Lahore and we don't know the exact and good path of Lahore then hundred percent chances for losing the way. So with these reasons researcher wants to study on this topic. Perception is basically the understanding of some topic. This comes from realistic information those information comes from sensory organs. The authentic and in organized way Authentic understanding of related topic is called perception which comes from the sensory organs. Perception is also awareness of something and we can also say that proper knowledge of particular topic is called perception. Perception is important in understanding human behavior because everyone perceives the environment and approaches life situations differently.

Who was the first to propose the friendly ghost hypothesis? Albert Bandura believes in the psychosocial hypothesis because learning is impacted by mental, behavioral, and environmental factors. (Bandura, 1991). Four factors in the friendly mental hypothesis (SCT; Bandura, 1982) hold that behavior is not fixed: objectives, result anticipations, self-adequacy, and Social Mental Hypothesis. As per SCT (Bandura, 1986, 1997), conduct is affected straight by objectives and self-adequacy assumptions and by implication by self-viability, result assumptions, and socio structural factors.

International Encyclopedia of the Social and Behavioral Sciences (Second Edition), Beth Kurtz-Costes, 2015. The sociocultural theory, social mental hypothesis, and bio ecological frameworks hypothesis depict how children learn within the home. The actual characteristics of the home and parent language usage provide a foundation for children's education. Guardian



convictions that determine their instructively significant ways of behaving include impressions of the child's talents, assumptions, generalizations, causal attributions, and values. Children benefit from direct instruction as well as seeing the behaviors of their parents and siblings. The school contribution of parents and the determination of children's out-of-home activities also influence learning. Using complicated models and advanced information scientific methodologies, the current project analyses social, public, and social class variation in these cycles.

Albert Bandura's (1971) social mental theory explains how children might grow by mimicking other shown ways of acting through a complimentary relationship between mental, behavioral, and environmental influences. Bandura emphasized that in order for this to occur, a few mental and emotional components must exist in the related partnership of exhibiting between an adult as an instructor and a child as an understudy. These components include learning contemplation, retention of what is remembered and realized, propagation or application of acquired concepts, and motivation or aim to learn .

1.1 Rationale of the Study

School counseling is very important for students. In school level they able to identify their interest area. It is also very beneficial for those students who have no proper guideline for their further study. If we read history we see that Aristotle and Plato was very good motivator. They also stressed on career counseling. If we see another point of view every messenger of Allah was also stressed on career guidance. Our holy prophet Hazrat Muhammad (P.B.U.H) was also great motivator. He gives too much stress on guidance. If we read western history we see that Greeks and Romans were very civilized nations. Their basic motive is on child guidance. Later on we see this is the duty of priest who gives guidance to the people. They used counseling in their preaching. At the end of 16th century first career counseling book The Universal plaza of all the professions of the World (Garzozoni 1626) published and boost importance of career guidance. Later on career guidance was comes in different countries in different shapes. Elementary level and secondary level students first and foremost need regarding their future is proper guidance. The word "Guide" means to giving directions and act as a torch bearer to help person in attaining their goals. So these are the trends which followed by our students. This is the main lope hole of our education system there is no proper channel to guide the students. There are five secondary schools in researcher sample. Three students from any school one hundred and students of five schools are in researcher sample.



3.3 Instruments

3.3.1 Open Ended Questionnaire

Researcher will develop questionnaire. There will two major parts of questionnaire. The first part of the questionnaire contained information about age, school type and geographical location. The second part will be on guidance, counseling and also behavioral issues. Researcher will conduct this questionnaire on one hundred and fifty students of 9th, 10th class. After receiving feedback researcher will be able to give any conclusion about this research with the help of supervisor. Researcher will distribute questionnaire personally to the students.

This is a descriptive case study of the students of 9th and 10th class in tehsil chakwal. Researcher will apply the social cognitive theory of Albert Bandura on this research. Researcher will use instruments like questionnaire, structured interviews and observation also. These three tools will used by researcher for collecting data. As for the approach of this investigation, is mixed methods.

CHAPTER#5

DATA ANALYSIS

5.1 Interview Analysis:



The tape-recorded interviews conducted by the researcher have provided him the clear picture of the orientation level of the students regarding their career in tehsil chakwal. Researcher totally interviewed 11 students from different schools of tehsil chakwal. Some students are clear about their future goals but mostly have no proper guidance and clearness about their career. All of them have shortage of counseling because they have no idea about their interest. They were just telling about which are the trends. Everyone was telling about the profession which will give fame and which is high ranked in society no one could focus on the satisfaction. Every participant was following the society trends and the thing which is set by the family. So I think there is too lack of the counseling in tehsil chakwal.

5.2 Observations' Analysis:

After conducting the tape recorded interview of 11 students. Researcher observe these students keenly they are totally on following the society trends. Those students who were clear about their goal and profession they are always energetic and also participate in all activities. Those students who were confused about their career choosing they are not working good. They look lazy all time. These students are not participating in class tasks. These are not brilliant student in class. There totally focus is on the outside activities. While those students who were clear about their goals they are good in all fields. Their performance is extra ordinary in games and in class. They feel energetic and working hard.

Researcher observes keenly two to three days on those students which are good and ordinary. Those students who gave clear answer about their future goals that are always energetic and good in their studies. They are good in studies. The main reason behind this is their family support is always with them. Their parents check their home tasks on daily basis and other family members are supporting him. S10 is good example he is always motivated about his studies. His father is clerk in Bahria University Islamabad. He wants to become Lecturer. His parents always support him. He is clearer about then rest of nine participants. He has much knowledge and I think he is book worm because he has good knowledge and examples for supporting his argument. S2, S4, S7, S8, S9 these participants are not clear about their career choosing because their dreams are big but they all want to opt these profession with the pressure of parents or society. These all are not clear about their future. Some want to become doctor but they feel satisfaction in cricket.

S3, S1, S10, S11, S5, S6 are choosing their career by heart. They have no pressure from society or parents. They are more energetic then those who are not clear about their future goals. These participants are good in all fields like studies and also in playing ground; they mostly want to gain knowledge about their career. Most of them have interest in reading in their interest area. Environment is the creator of the child. This thing varies surroundings to surroundings if your surroundings are healthy and energetic then you will already become healthy and energetic. Same thing apply on this thing if your friends and family members are supporting you and motivating you in career choosing then you will also cleared about it and give them good results.

According to Skogmyr Marian (2015), depending on one's memory during the process of conducting a lengthy interview is not a suitable method. To make the results more authentic and valid, the researcher produced a written qualitative questionnaire as well as recorded interviews and observations. In any case, the researcher avoided taking detailed notes during interviews and observations since it might have a detrimental influence on data collection quality. It has the potential to disturb the conversation and cause annoyance. Thus, the researcher has only taken brief notes in order to expound on them later. This method aided him in creating a comprehensive overview of the transcribed interviews and observations.

Furthermore, the circumstance in which the writing process occurs has changed. Furthermore, the environment in which the writing process takes place has a significant impact on the quality of information. It is the key concept for maintaining a peaceful and serene atmosphere. As a result, the researcher has ensured that participants are at ease and have a safe environment free of interruption. CHAPTER#6

6.1 Findings

6.2 Conclusion

There is no proper channel who counsel students and tell them their strength and give them proper way of achieving success and satisfaction in life. our society and family is not providing proper counsel to the students during their career crossing in tehsil chakwal we are not providing proper atmosphere and quality of counseling according to their need. Large numbers of students are wasting their time after getting matriculation because they have no proper guidance and counseling for their future goals.

On the other side there are limited numbers of students who have bit counseling and guidance from their teacher and from home. But they have no facilities about it . They have goal and realistic goal which is achievable but due to poor system they face much hurdles and most of them leave it and limited one just achieve it.

To conclude, researcher thought that in our schools we are just achieving only learning competence. There is no proper learning on goal setting and achieving targets. We are facing lots of problems due to lack of counseling and guidance. Our students are not achieving their goals because our totally focus is on achieving learning competence. We are not working on career planning and career counseling. This thing creates problems for our youth and also in country progress.

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
